THE FALL 2012 AND SPRING 2013 SEMESTERS HAVE SERVED AS A PILOT/IMPLEMENTATION YEAR FOR MOUNTAIN VIEW COLLEGE'S QEP - THE PEN IS OUR POWER.

PILOT YEAR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- 41 Writing Intensive and QEP-Enhanced courses were offered during the fall 2012 and spring 2013 semesters. This is significantly above the ten-course target for the pilot year. There are currently 41 course offerings from 11 disciplines scheduled for the fall 2013 semester.
- Success and persistence rates of students enrolled in Writing Intensive and/or QEP-Enhanced courses was above the overall college average.
- 30 hours of QEP professional development activities were offered to Mountain View College faculty and staff.
- 19 Mountain View College faculty members were certified to teach QEP courses.
- Mountain View College's first annual 'The Pen Is Our Power Writing Festival' was offered to students, staff and community members April 9-12, 2013.
