Warrior Path to Success Executive Summary

The East Central Community College Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP) is focused on at-risk first semester full-time students taking beginning level developmental classes: Beginning English, Beginning Reading, Beginning Algebra, and Basic Speech. Beginning English students are placed according to a 0-11 *ACT* score or a 0-25 *COMPASS* score; Beginning Reading students are placed according to a 0-11 *ACT* score or a 0-48 *COMPASS* score; Beginning Algebra students are placed according to a 0-13 *ACT* score or a 0-20 *COMPASS* score; Basic Speech placement is based on a 0-14 *ACT* score or completion of English Composition I. This target audience is typically limited to 150-200 students. The goal for the *Warrior Path to Success* students is to develop college success skills to promote retention and persistence to completion and graduation.

The program provides significant flexibility for the students while assuring that each class will:

- be facilitated by a program director and an instructor;
- be presented online to at-risk students in a lab-based setting through Dr. Marsha Fralick's College Success Online e-text program and Blackboard and will consist of an orientation module and fourteen personal improvement modules;
- be housed in the Eddie M. Smith Student Union Building in the Success/Testing/ WPS Center;
- be three credit hours (LLS 1313) that may be used as hours toward graduation at East Central and may be transferred to a four-year college;
- be required for at-risk first time full-time students based on placement eligibility;
- be evaluated on East Central's A-F grading scale;
- be assessed at the institutional level, the program level, and the course level;
- be a data-driven program.

With the implementation of *Warrior Path to Success* in August 2012, qualitative, quantitative, direct, and indirect measures; nationally-normed standardized surveys; and institutional assessment tools will be used to measure student learning outcomes. In summary, this plan will access student learning, employ multiple means of assessment, integrate with the College's overall-assessment process, and provide leadership to ensure that the assessment is accomplished.
